



SFBRA Shoreline Restoration Grants: Tribes encouraged to apply

Who are we?

The San Francisco Bay Restoration Authority (SFBRA) is a regional agency that funds shoreline projects that protect, restore, and enhance San Francisco Bay. We have roughly \$25M total each year, and grants typically range from \$300,000 to \$3M.

What is our jurisdiction?

We fund projects along the **shoreline of the nine counties of the Bay Area**. This includes **subtidal habitats** (areas below mean low tide), **baylands** (areas between maximum and minimum elevations of tides), and **transition zones** (uplands near tidal wetlands that provide transitional habitat).

What type of projects do we fund?

We fund projects that involve acquisition, planning, and implementation phases to:

- Restore, enhance, and protect natural habitats for fish, birds, and wildlife along the shoreline
- Provide flood protection within habitat restoration projects
- Increase public access to coastal resources within habitat restoration projects
- Prioritize equity
- Incorporate tribal leadership

What Resources do we provide?

We provide grant funding and technical support to local communities, nonprofit organizations, tribes, and public agencies.

This might look like:

- Working with tribes to meet eligibility requirements
- Discussing and co-developing projects with tribes
- Navigating the application process
- Assistance with invoicing and reporting
- Connecting tribes to fiscal sponsors

Our competitive grant round is open for applications summer to fall, but we are open to working with tribes outside of our regular grant round.
